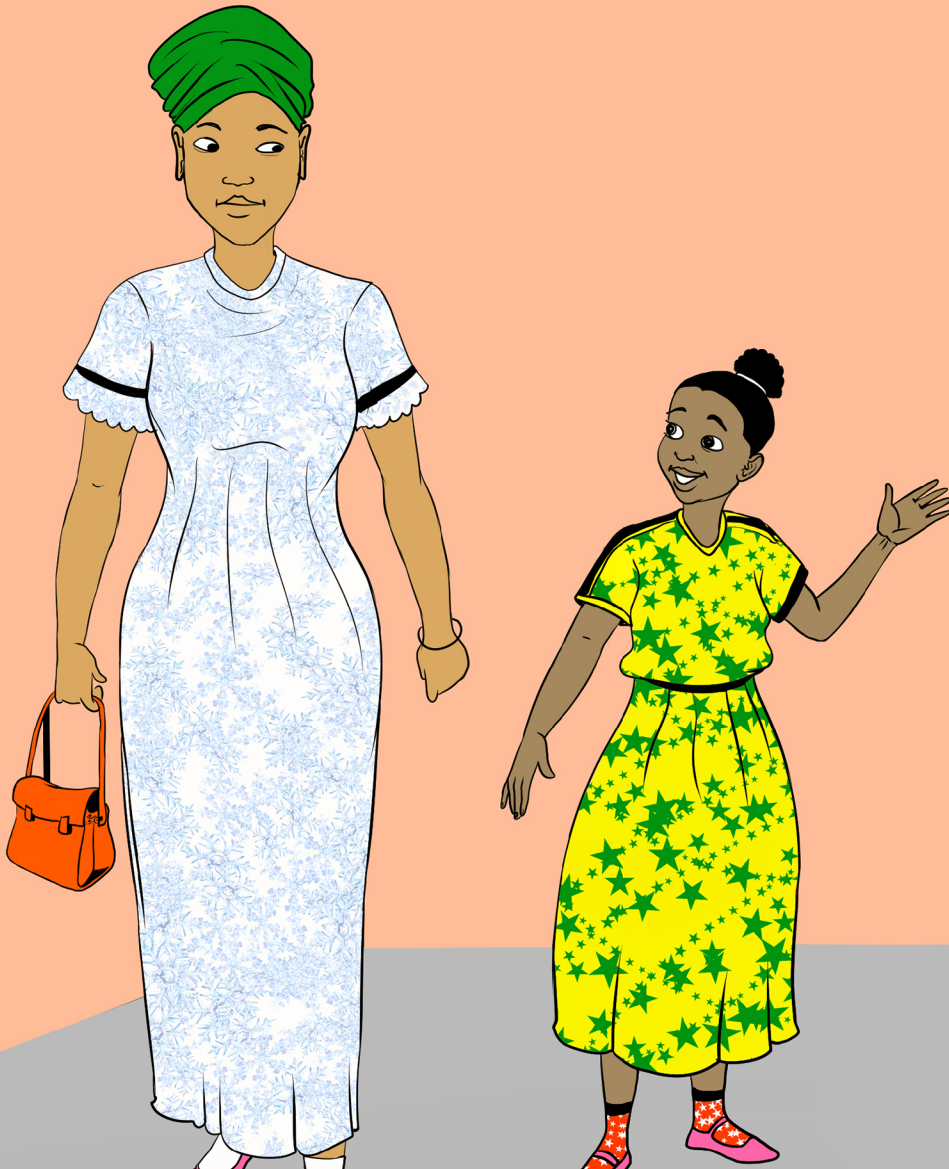

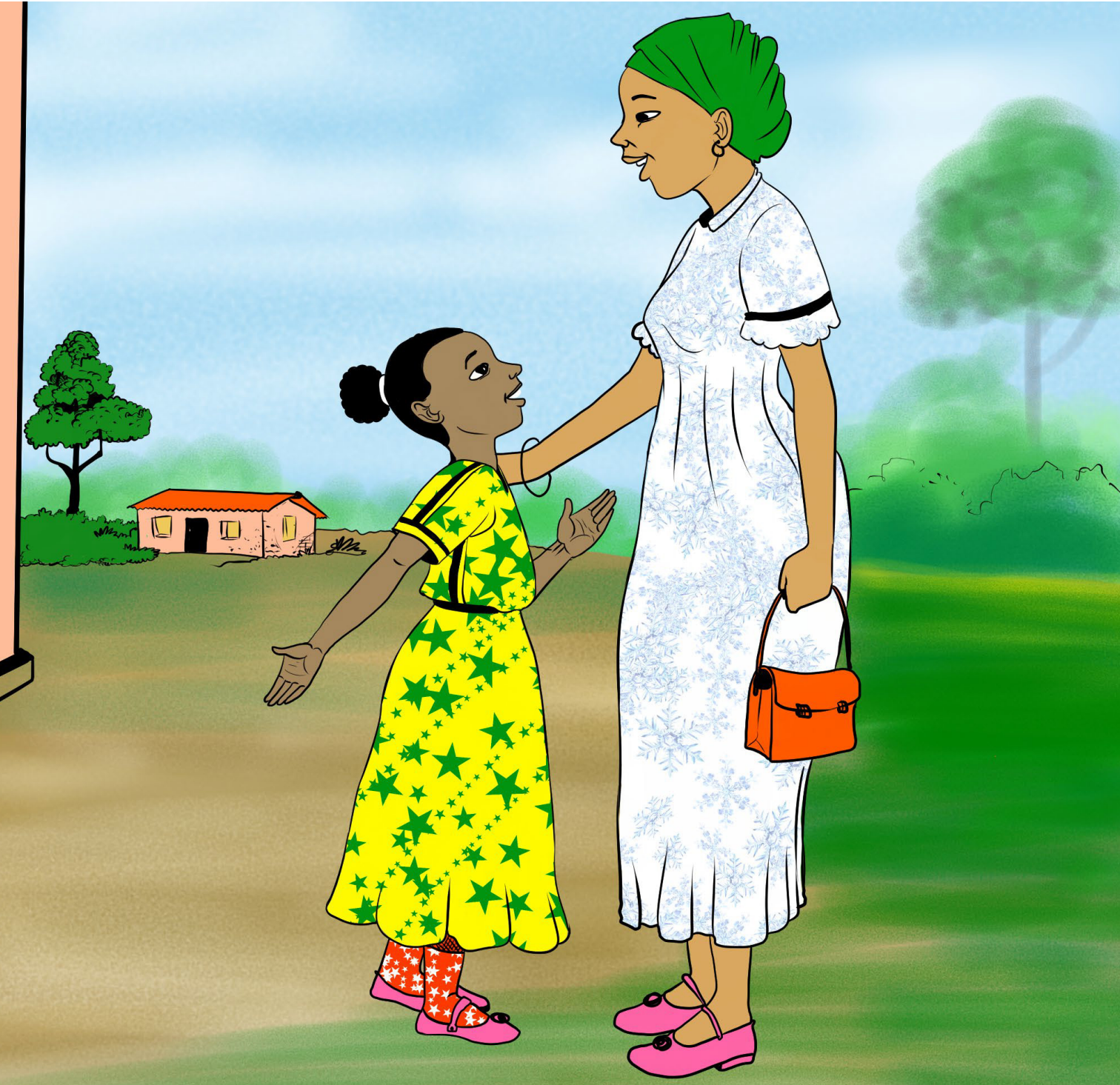
Once upon a time in Zuba village, there lived a small family of a father, a mother and their daughter, Mutima.
